International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN) Commentary re Pope Francis Visit to Hiroshima and Nagasaki

November 24, 2019

Pope Francis will pay an official visit to Japan from November 23, during which he will attend gathering in the atomic bombed cities of Hiroshima and Nagasaki on Sunday November 24. It is expected that he will convey strong messages for the abolition of nuclear weapons from both of those cities, and representatives of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN), 2017 Nobel Peace Laureate, will be present at both.

Akira Kawasaki is a member of the Executive Committee of Peace Boat and a member of the International Steering Group of the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN). A core member of ICAN's leadership since 2010, he served as Co-Chair of ICAN from August 2012 to June 2014. Since 2008, Kawasaki coordinates the "Global Voyage for a Nuclear-Free World: Peace Boat Hibakusha Project," in which atomic bomb survivors travel the world to share their stories and call for a nuclear free world. He lectures at Keisen University in Tokyo and writes frequently for Japanese newspapers and for peace and disarmament journals.

Setsuko Thurlow was a 13-year-old schoolgirl when the United States dropped an atomic bomb on her city, Hiroshima. Today, she is a leading figure in the International Campaign to Abolish Nuclear Weapons (ICAN). Her powerful speeches have inspired countless individuals around the world to take action for disarmament. She jointly received the Nobel Peace Price on behalf of the campaign at the ceremony in Oslo in 2017.
