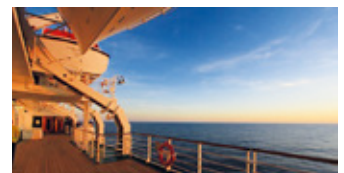
Our diverse programmes support the UN's Sustainable Development Goals for a more sustainable and resilient world – with no one left behind. Examples include:
